


Some Definitions

Open Educational Resources (OER): OER is defined as "teaching, learning, and research resources that reside in the public domain or have been released under an intellectual property license that permits their free use and re-purposing by others." Unlike traditionally copyrighted material, these resources are available for "open" use, which means users can edit, modify, customize, and share them.


Licensing Types

Public Domain: A designation for content that is not protected by any copyright law or other restriction and may be freely copied, shared, altered, and republished by anyone. **Creative Commons**: Open license that gives everyone from individual authors to governments and institutions a simple, standardized way to grant copyright permissions to their creative work, provided by Creative Commons.

Digital is NOT a barrier









Awareness IS a barrier




AWARENESS OF OPEN EDUCATIONAL RESOURCES AND CREATIVE COMMONS: 2014-15 TO 2019-20



Awareness of OER has steadily increased, but a majority of faculty are still unaware.

OER incentives can make a huge difference



Conclusions

- The largest barrier for OER adoption is awareness it can't be adopted if it is not a known option
 - OER initiatives has proven to increase awareness
 - Many cited barriers do not seem to be real barriers
 - Cost, quality, and digital-format are on par or better to non-OER options
- One more note: Supporting and training helps
 Regardless of type of curriculum used, faculty give
 higher ratings if they received PD for it

Open Textbook Pilot Grant Program

- Supports projects at institutions of higher education that create or expand the use of open textbooks to achieve savings for students.
- First funded by Congress in the bipartisan fiscal year 2018 government spending bill then renewed annually
- \$24 million has been appropriated for open textbook programs that benefit students across the country.

Affordable College Textbook Act

The Affordable College Textbook Act (H.R.2107/S.1036) would reduce the cost of textbooks at U.S. colleges and universities by expanding the use of open textbooks
