Survey Overview

Design

- Quick survey, can be completed in under 5 minutes
- A single survey for administrators and faculty, flexibly designed to show only the relevant questions for each respondent
- Privacy guaranteed

Process:

- Two weeks of data collection: August 4 to August 14, 2020
- Completed online

Results:

- 887 U.S. Higher Education faculty and administrator respondents
- Represent 597 different institutions
- Merged with the Integrated Postsecondary Education Data System (IPEDS) for institutional characteristics




I feel prepared to teach online this fall





Administrators: Institutions are ready for online


My institution is prepared to teach online this fall





Faculty: Multiple PD options


Recommended and/or provided professional development





Faculty: PD was effective


Professional development was effective






Faculty: Student engagement is key

"The online learning genie is out of the bottle."

"Will make people seriously question the need for higher ed. Will become a transaction more than a relationship."

"We may have to offer simultaneous zooming from class all the time now."

"It will show people that some classes are well suited for remote learning, and take away the stigma that some people still have regarding remote learning."

"I think it will be the end of face to face classes."

"Higher education will increasingly use flipped classrooms and online resources to enhance the classroom experience."

"The biggest impact will be that online learning will transform from a choice to a requirement."



Administrator: Post-pandemic

"Some institutions will close. Some will emerge as a shadow of what they were previously. Others, with effective leadership will make difficult choices and come out stronger."

"Higher education will increasingly move online and it will become the predominant delivery method."

"Students will recognize that sitting in a lecture hall being talked at isn't an effective way for them to learn."

"Increased value for the campus experience — students who now have done both understand what is lost when campus is closed."

"It may force faculty who were resistant to using technology to be more engaged."

"The pandemic has made us leaner, more responsive, and more creative."
